Office on Victims of Crime Releases FY 24 Human Trafficking Grants and Funding Opportunities

OVC funding supports efforts to develop, expand, and strengthen programs for victims of sex and labor trafficking. Funding opportunities exist to support anti-trafficking efforts nationwide.

NEWS

Mills Includes \$6M for Crime Victim Services in Supplemental Budget

After a six-million-dollar cut to the federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), Maine victim service providers braced for serious impact. VOCA is a primary funding source for programs that support victims of crime, including trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation. To offset the federal cut, victim services providers advocated for months at the State House to have the gap filled in the Governor's supplemental budget.



<u>Judiciary Committee Unanimously Endorses Bill to Support Survivors of Violent Crime</u>

LD 2084, championed by Sen. Anne Carney, D-Cape Elizabeth, would provide ongoing funding for state programs that are typically supported by VOCA funding, with \$6 million budgeted for the 2024-25 fiscal year.
