[Senate Passes Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act](#)

On Monday, the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act and the Abolish Human Trafficking Act passed in the Senate. This legislation has bipartisan support and strengthens and reauthorizes key programs that support survivors of human trafficking and provides resources to law enforcement officials. The National Human Trafficking Hotline created a written report that takes a deep dive into data collected from the 27,201 phone calls, 1,580 emails, and 2,137 online tips received in 2016. The report includes a break-down by who is calling, reasons for calling, age, gender, location, and venue of the potential trafficking.
